



SHANKARODATHAMME SHARANAM

The Sree Shankarodath Kavu annual festival celebrations will formally commence on **Sunday, February 22, 2026**, with the sacred **Kooraidal** ceremony. This ritual, will be performed under the presiding authority of the Temple Tantri, **Brahmasri Shankarodath Ambotti Thampuran** and will take place in the presence of the villagers, Kovilakam members, the Urayamakars (traditional trustees), and the local devotee community.

Following the Kooraidal, the **Parayeduppu** will begin. During this auspicious ritual, the **Velichappadu** (the deity's representative) will visit houses throughout the locality to receive offerings of paddy in the traditional *Para* measure, symbolizing the Goddess's blessings for prosperity and well-being in every home.

Dear Devotees,

We are pleased to inform you that the annual **Kumbha Bharani Mahotsavam**—including the sacred rituals of *Chanthattam*, *Guruthi Pooja*, and *Deshavela* — at Sree Shankarodath Kavu in Thekkumpuram, Kavilpad, will be celebrated on a grand scale from **February 22 to 24, 2026** (Kumbham 10, 11, and 12).

We cordially invite all well-wishers and devotees to participate in these auspicious festivities and receive the blessings of the Divine Mother, Jagadambika.

- **Sunday, February 22 (Kumbham 10) 10.40 AM – Chanthattam:** Special anointment ritual performed for the *Sapta Matrikas* (Seven Mother Goddesses).
- **Sunday, February 22 (Kumbham 10) 07.30 PM – Kalam Puja (Dhaarikavadham Kalamezhuthu Paattu):** Performed by Kadambazhipuram Sukumar Kurup.
- **Monday, February 23 (Kumbham 11) 12:00 PM – Maha Guruthi Pooja:** A major ritual offering (12 *Uruli Guruthi*) highly pleasing to the Goddess, performed with deep devotion.
- **Tuesday, February 24 (Kumbham 12) – The Main Bharani Vela:** The *Bharani Vela* will be observed with traditional ceremonies, including *Chamaya Chaprachamaradhi*, and a grand procession featuring decorated bulls (*Kalavela*), chariot (*Theru*), and majestic elephant (*Gajaveeras*).
 - **4:00 PM – Commencement of Deshavela:** The ceremonial procession begins from the presence of **Mangodu Ilaya Bhagavathy (Kozhikodi Amma)**, the guardian deity of the western boundary of Kavilpad. The procession will showcase traditional art forms and ritual elements: *Koodu*, *Kuda*, *Poothan*, *Thira*, *Kalavela*, *Chariot*, and *Kavadi* and will be accompanied by *Bhagavathy's* sword & pedestal, the *Velichappad* (Oracle), *Vaalenthiya Padanayakans* (Warriors holding swords), with the rhythmic beats of *Panchavadyam* alongside the elephant.
 - **9:00 PM – Kavu Kayaral:** The procession will reach **Sree Shankarodath Kavu**.
 - **Night Rituals:** Following the *Athazha Pooja* (evening puja) and *Karivela*, the sacred *Tholpavakoothu* (Shadow Puppetry) will be performed.
 - **Night Vela & Thalapoli:** The deity will be escorted back in a procession from *Arallichuvadu Neelavattarikkavu*, Thekkumpuram to **Sree Shankarodath Kavu**. The festival concludes with the ritualistic *Kambam Kathikkal*.

We request the wholehearted cooperation and participation of all devotees to make this festival a spiritual success.
